Regulations

1 Title

These regulations are the Customs Revenue and Border Protection Amendment Regulations 2016.

- 2 Commencement
- (1) Regulation 4 comes into force on 1 July 2016.
- (2) The rest of these regulations come into force on the day after the date on which these regulations are made.

3 Principal regulations amended

These regulations amend the Customs Revenue and Border Protection Regulations 2012.

4 Regulation 33 amended (Import entry transaction fee)

Regulation 33(1) is amended by omitting "of \$10 must be paid unless the entry is made using a Customs computerised entry processing system," and substituting ", which fee is \$10 for an entry made using a Customs computerised entry processing system and is \$20 for an entry made using a Customs manual processing system, must be paid".

Regulation 33(6) is amended by omitting the word "inclusive" and subsisting the word "exclusive" so as to read "The import entry fee is exclusive of value added tax."

5 Schedule 2 amended (Forms)

Schedule 2 is amended by repealing form 3 (Cook Islands Passenger Arrival Card) and substituting the new form 3 in the Schedule to these regulations.
