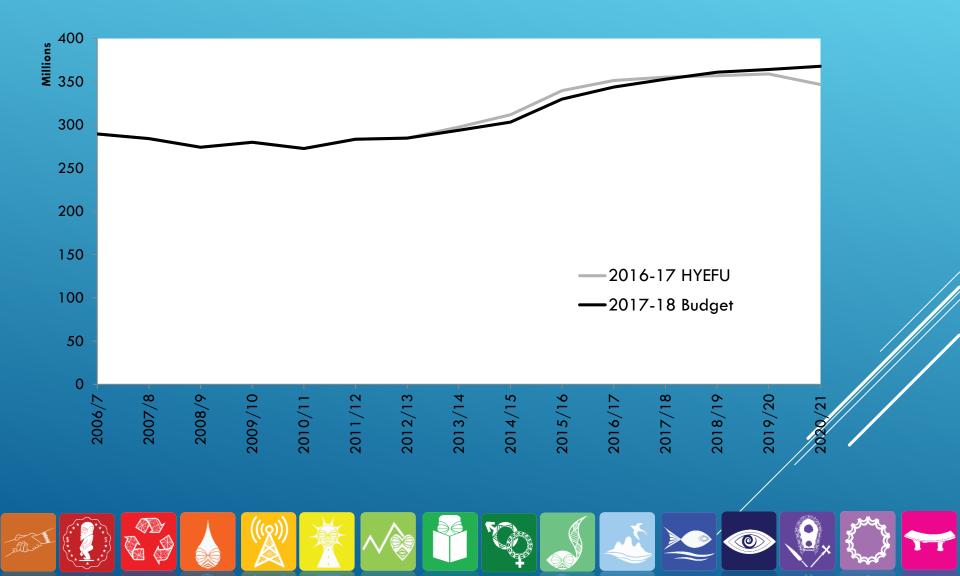

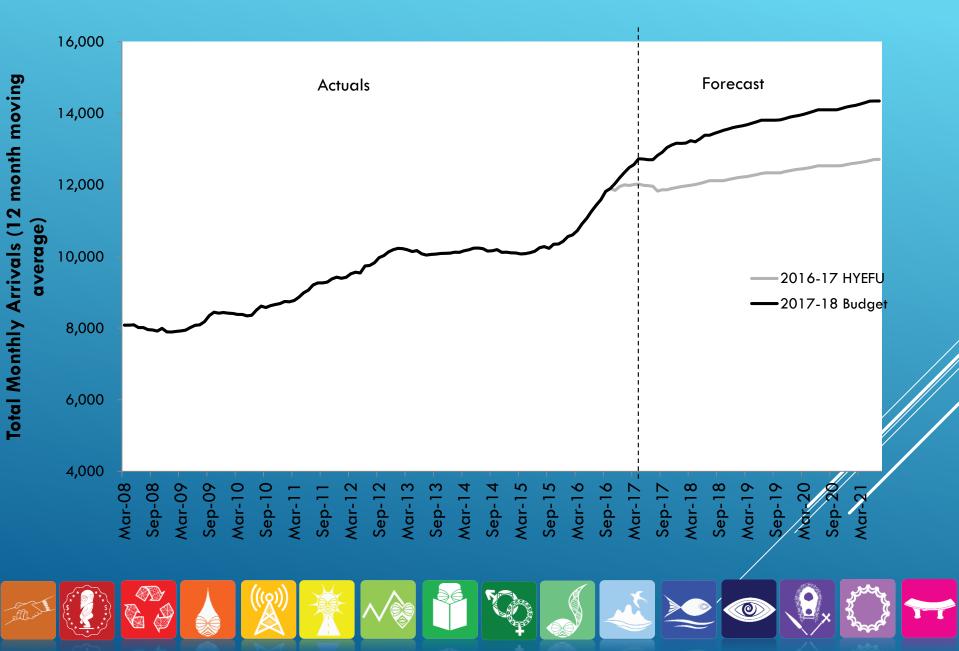
OVERVIEW

- The economy is estimated to have grown at a rate of 4 per cent in 2016/17, continuing on from strong growth in 2015/16.
- Growth has largely been driven by higher than expected tourist arrivals
- > This has increased Government revenue in 2016/17
- Going forward, revenue will moderate slightly in 2017/18 due to Government policy to relieve businesses and individuals of tax debt

TOURISM ARRIVALS



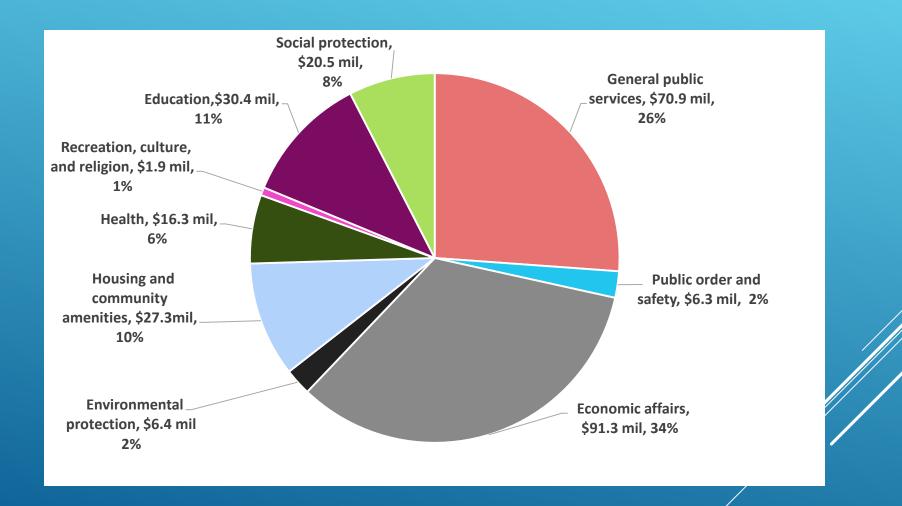
OVERVIEW

- Complements significant spending by donor partners on key infrastructure

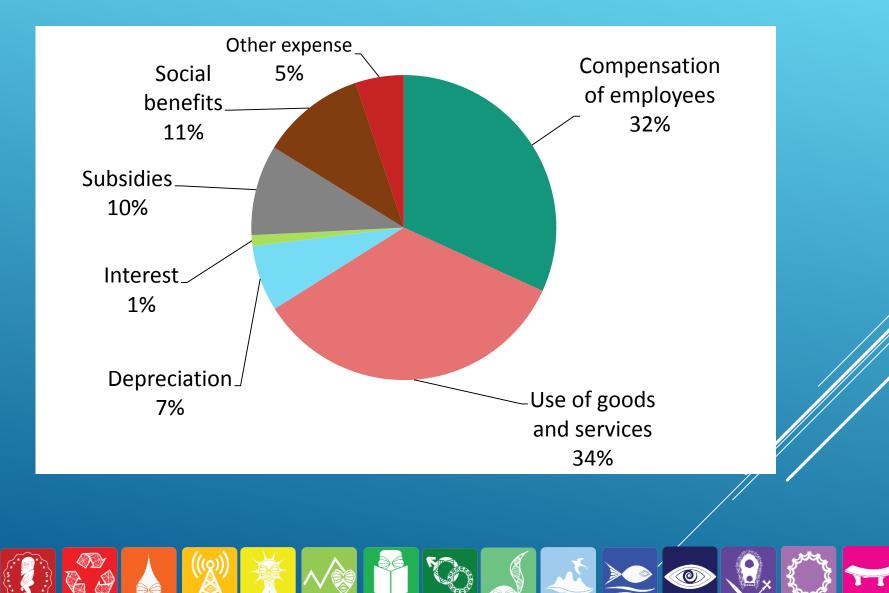

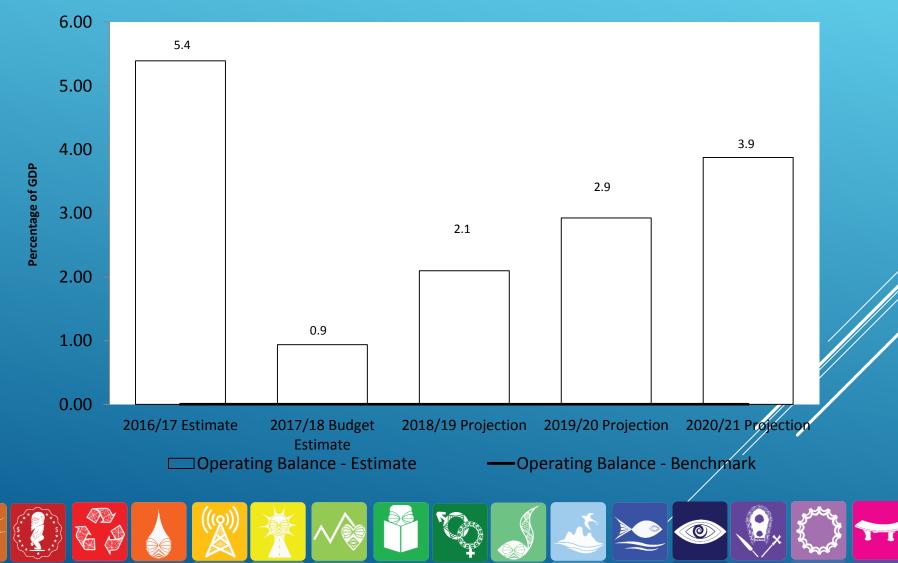
SPENDING BY FUNCTION OF GOVERNMENT



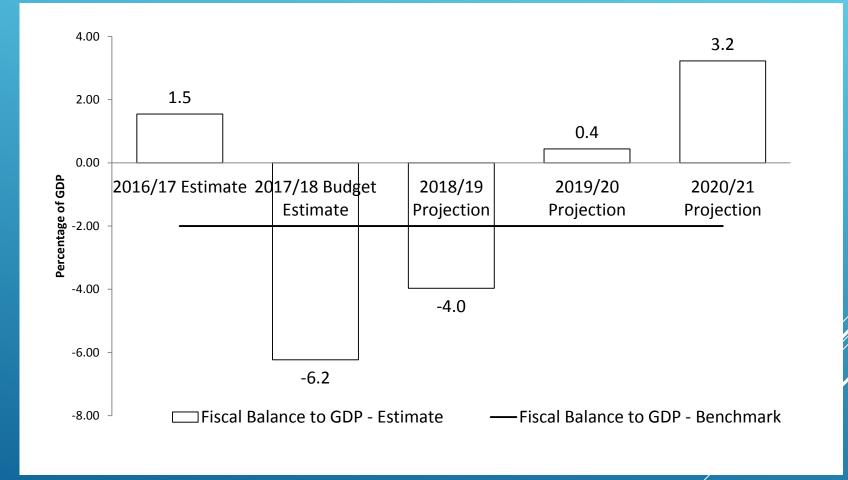
SPENDING BY EXPENDITURE TYPE



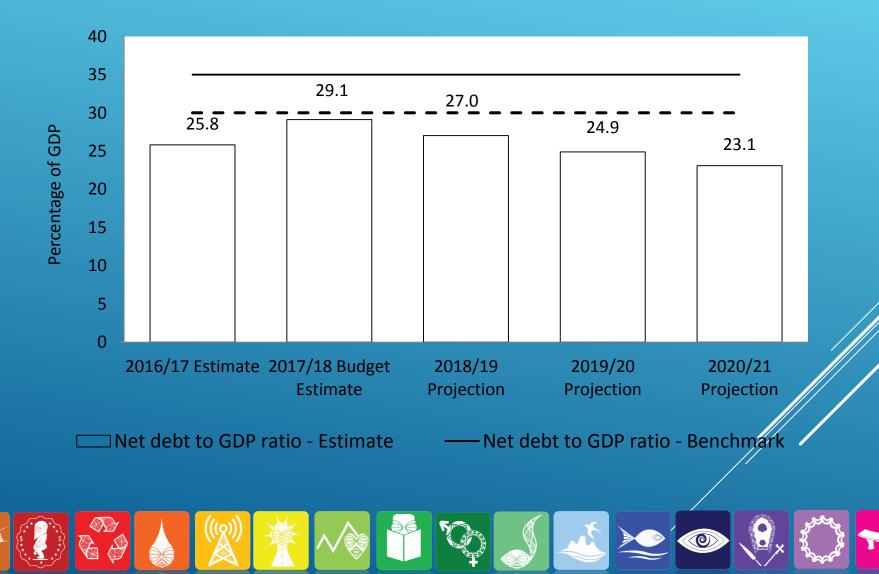
FISCAL RATIOS – OPERATING BALANCE TO GDP



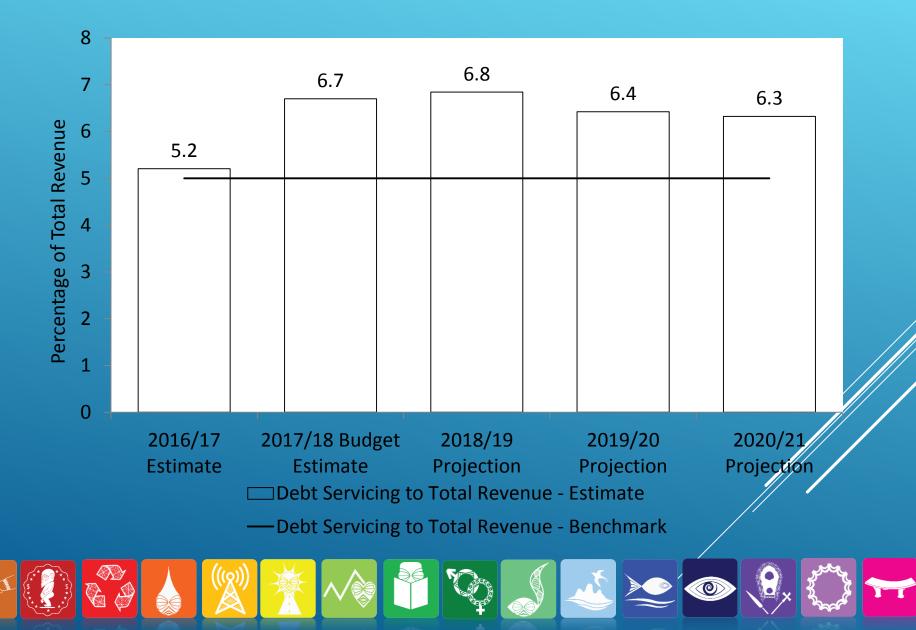
FISCAL RATIOS – FISCAL BALANCE TO GDP



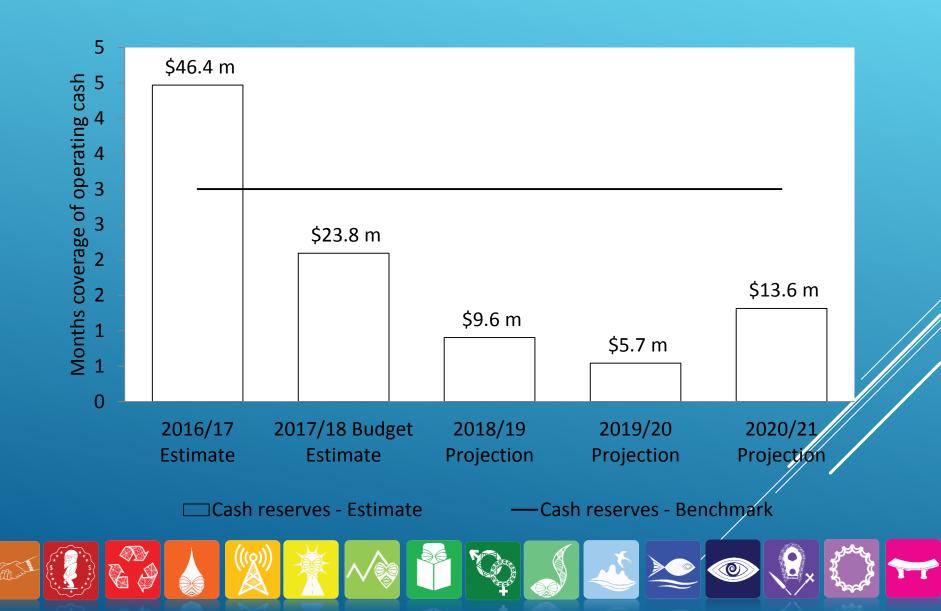
FISCAL RATIOS – DEBT NET TO GDP



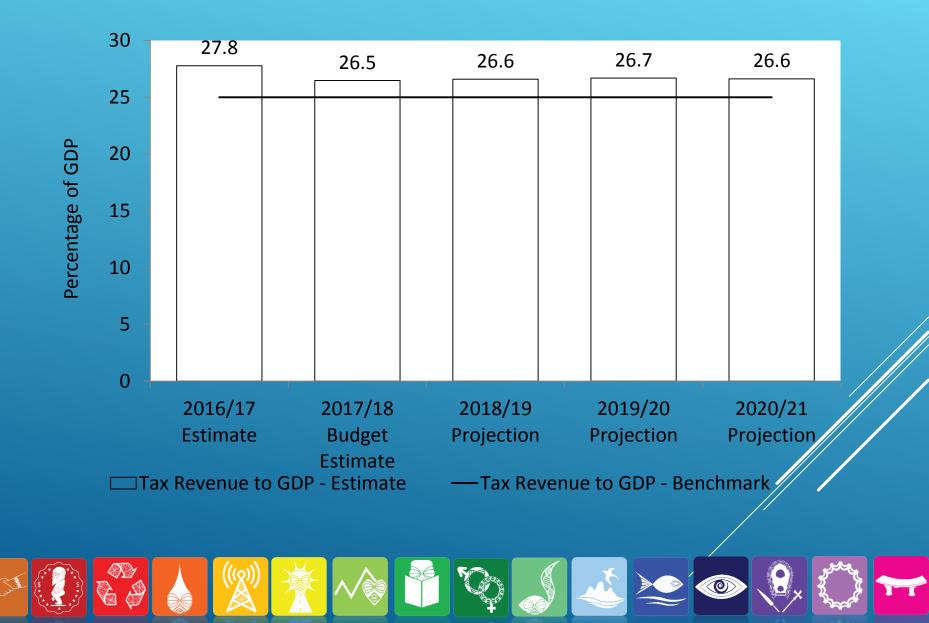
FISCAL RATIOS – DEBT SERVICE TO REVENUE



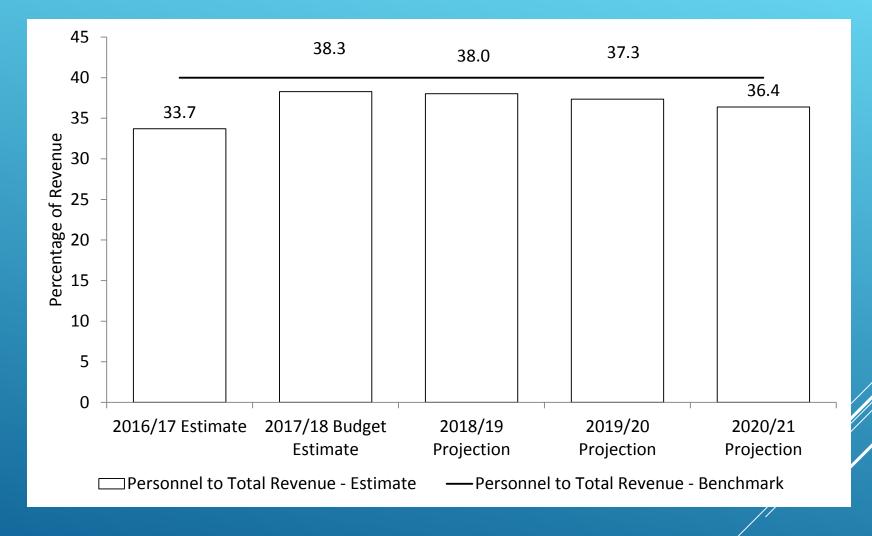
FISCAL RATIOS* – CASH RESERVES
